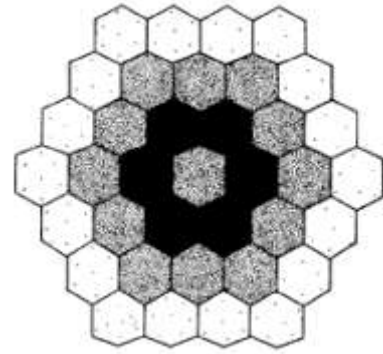
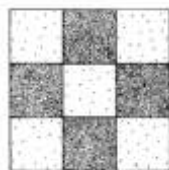

General Membership Meeting Minutes

Darlene Dixon greeted the group and called attention to the lovely quilt hanging in the room. It was done by JoAnne Langley. She reported the minutes for the February meeting are in the Beeline and have been corrected and approved. She reminded the group that any additions or corrections must be made in writing to the President or the Recording Secretary.

Treasurer's Report:

Treasurer's report was given by Grace Pace and will be filed for audit. Balance forward, deposits for the month, total income for the month, budget operating expenses and available expenses were given.

Documentation:

Leilani Brechbill informed the group there is \$4800.00 left to distribute. Four charities have been chosen.

La Torte Quilt Guild – Will receive \$1000 for documentation in Cumberland County. A good faith contract should be done to assure project completion before monies are given.

Franklin County Foundation: Initially gave our guild \$5000. We will return \$2300 so monies can be used to help other guilds.

Make A Wish Foundation: Will receive \$500 for use in Franklin County.

Kittochinny Historical Society – Will receive \$1000 as they are the keepers of our records.

There will be added monies because some books are still out and will be placed into the Treasury.

Ruth Mollack informed the group of committee balance, deposits, expenses and final balance.

Baby and Doll Quilts

It was announced we are still accepting baby and doll quilts. Doll quilts are to be submitted to Linda Dahlmann. Baby quilts will be accepted by Linda Kirkland and Betty Niswander. All quilts are to be entirely completed when given to committee members.

Quilt Show:

Dottie Moreland informed the group Quilt Show info cards are available to be distributed to friends and shops. She informed the group there are signup sheets for volunteers to help with the many different needs of our show committees in the back of the room. All members are encouraged to assist in our July Quilt Show.

Retreat:

Dottie Moreland told the group that the retreat is still open as long as payment is made by the April meeting. She asked the group to register now even if they don't pay until April so she will have a head count.

Nominating Committee:

Grace Pace reported on the progress the committee was making. The facilities committee was discussed as a challenge to fill due to the amount of time and labor expended. Adding more people was suggested as well as limiting socializing to the kitchen after the meetings so the room can be promptly reassembled. Any suggestions for nominations were requested.

Sunshine Committee:

Lee Hively reported Theresa Silver's husband suffered a heart attack. Peg Buck's husband is still in poor health. Barbara Shane's mother died. She requested we keep all in our prayers.

Miscellaneous

Darlene Dixon welcomed guests. She stressed the many benefits she has received for participation in the guild activities.

There were no new members.

A member info scavenger hunt, designing a paper quilt block, and bingo were some of the activities. 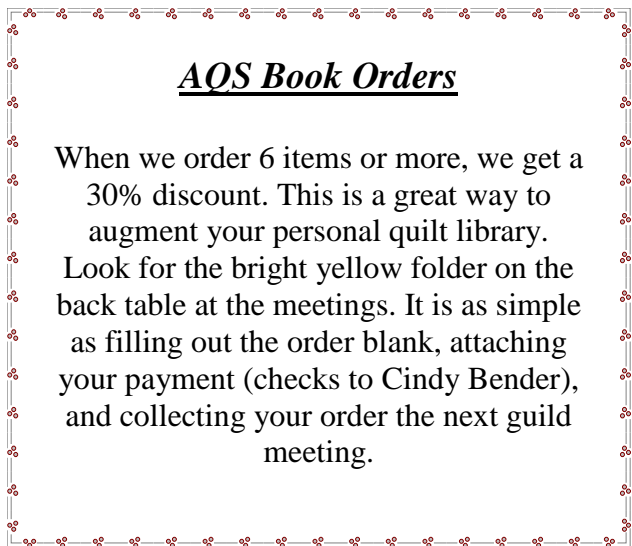

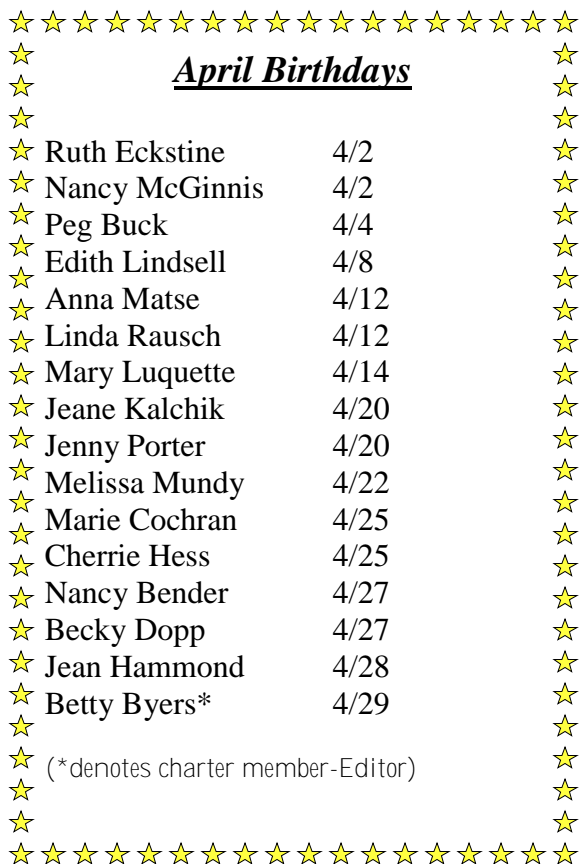

Disappearing 9-Patch Workshop

Here is the supply list for the workshop. You may make this as scrappy as you like. You will need a total of 180 5-inch squares cut before the day of the workshop.

Envision that you are starting with a 9-patch block. Decide what you would want in the center (20 squares), in the corners (80 squares) and then in the middle of the sides (80 squares).

You will also need your machine, thread, pins, rotary cutter, 24" ruler, and a cutting matt (No smaller than 18-inches - maybe you could share with someone).

If you would like the directions with the picture of my quilt; please let me know. I can email it or snail mail.

The Quilt World Mourns Two Losses

Quiltmaker Jean Ray Laury passed away on March 2. She was age 82 years old. Jean had been an integral force during the second quilt revival in the 1970s and a regular contributor to magazines such as a Quilters Newsletter Magazine. Jean's fun loving spirit and sense of humor was not only found in her work but also in many of the books she published. She had been inducted into the Quilters Hall of Fame in the early 1980s.

On another sad note, Lucinda Cawley also passed away . "Cinda" was an avid quilt historian and co-authored, Saved For the People of Pennsylvania: Quilts from the Collection of the State Museum of Pennsylvania.

Cinda was considered one of the leading scholars regarding Pennsylvania Fraktur quilts, besides her published work on this subject she had also served on the board of the American Quilt Study Group.

Cinda believed that "all quilt patterns originated in Pennsylvania."

The SPRING RETREAT is **APRIL 15 -17, 2011**. Again you can go extra nights such as Tuesday, April 12, Wednesday, April 13, and/ or Thursday, April 14, at an additional fee.

The retreat is held at the Byers Conference Center at the Roxbury Camp in Roxbury, PA. It is a weekend to “eat, sleep, & quilt”. You bring whatever projects you want to work on along with your sewing machine if you want and spend the weekend quilting while the

Roxbury staff feed us and take care of everything for us. It’s a lot of fun and you get to know other members during the weekend.

The sleeping rooms are like 5-star hotel room. There will be registration sheets available at the January meeting to sign up for the retreat.

You can pay ½ or the entire retreat fee when you sign up in January. The total fee must be paid by the April meeting. If you have any questions about this, please see Dottie Moreland or Joyce Randolph.

The rates for the retreat are as follows:
Weekend rate – this includes 2 nights lodging (Friday & Saturday) and 5 meals starting Friday evening

\$122/person – double occupancy

\$131/person – single occupancy

Extra nights – no food service on Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday

\$40/ night/.person – double occupancy

\$45/night/person – single occupancy

If you are sharing a room with a room mate for the weekend and you want to come the extra nights and your room mate doesn’t, then the extra nights will be at the single occupancy rate for you while the 2 weekend nights will be at the double occupancy rate for you and your room mate.

If you can’t come for the entire weekend you can come on a daily basis at a nominal fee of \$6/day plus the meal fee, or for \$11/ day without the meal.
