Drop off for the Quilt Show will be on Thursday, July 16th beginning at 9:00 a.m. at the Presbyterian Church of Falling Spring on North Main Street in Chambersburg. OR Wednesday evening from 5 – 7 pm at Sew'n Place.

We will have three areas set up for you to drop off your quilt. Look for the table with the first letter of your last name. Quilts must be in a pillow case and ready to be hung, clean and with a hanging sleeve. You will receive a receipt with your name and entry number, a receipt will also be pinned to the pillowcase. You **MUST** have this receipt to pick up your quilt Saturday evening. If you have someone else pickup the quilt, they **MUST** have the receipt.

When the show is over the quilt will be placed back in the pillowcase with the receipt. You may pick up your quilt at the drop off table after the show on Saturday between 5:30 and 6:30 pm. **The quilts will be released after all of the quilt frames have been taken down and removed. You MUST provide your receipt to pick up your quilt.**

\*\*\*REMINDER: Quilts cannot be picked up until after all clean-up is com-

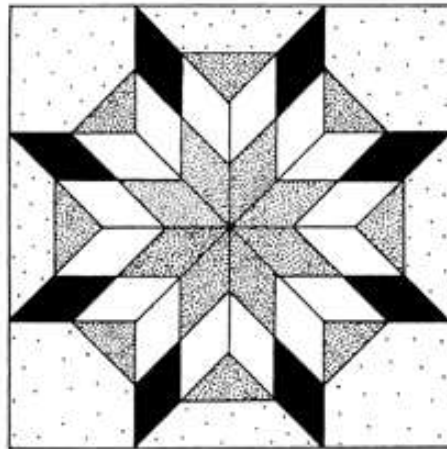
### Quilt Show Attire

## Summer Quilt Bees -

The remaining summer quilt bees will be held July 27<sup>th</sup> and August 24<sup>th</sup>, 2007. Bees are held from 9:30am to 2:00pm.

The **July 27<sup>th</sup>** bee will be at the home of Joyce Randolph 6297 Burning Tree Lane, Fayetteville (352-8276). Bring a bag lunch. Your beverage and dessert will be furnished.

Directions; **From route 30, take 997 south. Joyce lives just north of Penn national Golf Club & Inn. Turn right (northwest) onto Fairway Drive West. go 0.1 mile & turn right onto Burning tree terrace. go 0.1 mile & turn left onto burning tree lane. go to the 6th house on the right — #6297.**

The **August 24<sup>th</sup>** bee will be held at the home of Sue Frederick 805 Antrim Lane, Greencastle (597-2200). This bee will be our annual salad luncheon. Bring a salad ingredient prepared and ready to toss. The salad is always different and always the best ever!

Directions; **Take the Marian exit off of I 81. from points north; turn left. From points south; turn right. Turn right onto Horst road. This is the first road you will come to. Stay on Horst road until you come to a stop sign.. Turn left.**

**You are now on Clay Hill Road. Watch for a “Village of Clay Hill” sign. Turn right onto Antrim Church Road, just after the sign. Go up and then down the hill. At the bottom of the hill turn right onto Antrim Lane. Sue’s house is the first one on the right — #805.**

## PILLOWCASE WITH HIDDEN SEAMS

Standard Pillowcase: 20” x 31”

Supplies: 3/4 yard fabric for body  
1/3 yard fabric for border

Cutting: caud body of the case 26.5” x 40.5”  
Cut border 10.5” x 40.5”

Sewing:

Place border fabric face up (not folded)

Place case fabric (wrong side up) along border fabric end to end. In other words, right sides together.

Starting at bottom of case fabric, roll case fabric up until you get to the border fabric and then a bit more so that the rolled fabric is laying half way onto the border fabric.

Take hold of the bottom of the border fabric and align along the top of the border/case fabrics giving you three layers of fabric. The border fabric is folded over the rolled portion of the case fabric.

All three portions of fabric will meet together at the top border and then you pin all three layers together.

Sew the pinned seam, taking a 1/2 inch seam allowance.

Pull the rolled portion of case fabric out of the middle and now you should have a “finished” border with the case fabric attached and encased in the border (no seams showing).

Then fold right sides together (border to border) and using a 1/2 inch seam allowance, sew right sides together down the side and across the bottom.

Pull right side out and you have a pillowcase!

## Quilt Full of Holes

As I faced my Maker at the last judgment, I knelt before the Lord along with all the other souls. Before each of us laid our lives like the squares of a quilt in many piles; an angel sat before each of us sewing our quilt squares into a tapestry that is our life.

But as my angel took each piece of cloth off the pile, I noticed how ragged and empty each of my squares was. They were filled with giant holes. Each square was labeled with a part of my life that had been difficult, the challenges and the temptations I was faced with in every day life. I saw hardships that I endured, which were the largest holes of all.

I glanced around me. Nobody else had such squares. Other than a tiny hole here and there, the other tapestries were filled with rich color and the bright hues of worldly fortune. I gazed upon my own life and was disheartened.

My angel was sewing the ragged pieces of cloth together, threadbare and empty, like binding air.

Finally the time came when each life was to be displayed, held up to the light, the scrutiny of truth. The others rose; each in turn, holding their tapestries. So filled their lives had been. My angel looked upon me, and nodded for me to rise.

My gaze dropped to the ground in shame. I hadn't had all the earthly fortunes. I had love in my life, and laughter. But there had also been trials of illness and wealth, and false accusations that took from me my world as I knew it. I had to start over many times. I often

struggled with temptation to quit, only to somehow muster the strength to pick up and begin again. I spent many nights on my knees in prayer asking for help and guidance in my life. I had often been held up to ridicule, which I endured painfully, each time offering it up to the Father in hopes that I would not melt within my skin beneath the judgmental gaze of those who unfairly judged me.

And now, I had to face the truth. My life was what it was, and I had to accept it for what it was.

I rose and slowly lifted the combined squares of my life to the light. An awe-filled gasp filled the air. I gazed around at the others who stared at me with wide eyes.

Then, I looked upon the tapestry before me. Light flooded the many holes, creating an image, the face of Christ. Then our Lord stood before me, with warmth and love in His eyes. He said, "Every time you gave over your life to Me, it became My life, My hardships, and My struggles.....Each point of light in your life is when you stepped aside and let Me shine through, until there was more of Me than there was of you.'

May all of our quilts be threadbare and worn, allowing Christ to shine through!
