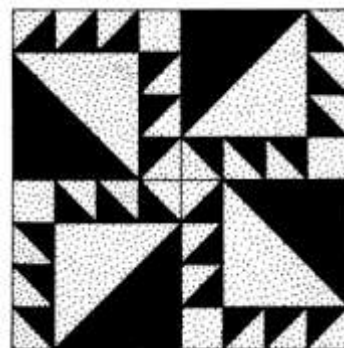
Quilter's Game Day

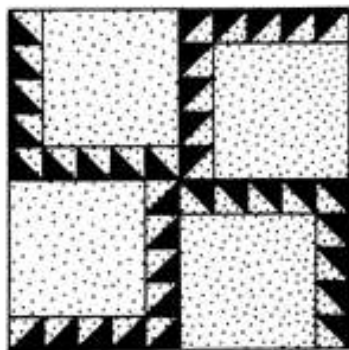

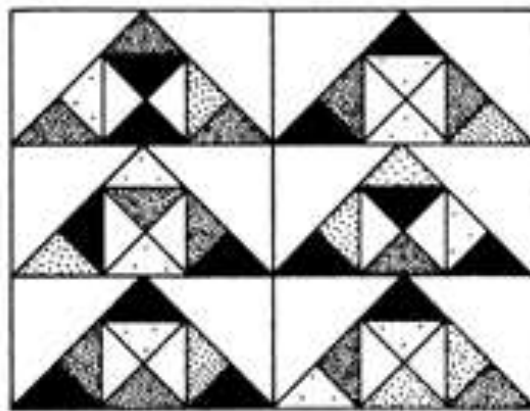

## **Quilt Documentation Disbursement Committee**

We are on our last stage of disbursing the money from the sale of our documentation book, *QUILT TREASURES OF YESTER-YEAR*. Our committee, Lee Hively, Elizabeth Basliko, Barbara Taylor and Leilani Brechbill, met January 17th to decide who the recipients would be.

The recipients for the remaining money are LeTort Quilt Guild, (to do their documentation), Franklin County Foundation (who gave us a large amount), Make a Wish Foundation (with the money to stay in Franklin County), and Kittochinny Historical Society. This is pending the approval of the Guild Board and the vote of the general membership. Our first disbursement was given to the House of Grace, The Cold Weather Shelter, Holiday Helping Hands, Women in Need, Meals on Wheels, Franklin County Library System (Coyle Free and Grove Family Library), Sweet Adelines, and Council of the Arts.

As a committee, we have tried our best to give to those in need, to the arts, to organizations that have helped us to achieve what we have done, and the organizations that want to do future documentations. Our book will be a legacy we have given to other generations to enjoy, learn from, and who want to learn more about quilting.

## **Disappearing 9-Patch Workshop**

Here is the supply list for the workshop. You may make this as scrappy as you like. You will need a total of 180 5-inch squares cut before the day of the workshop.

Envision that you are starting with a 9-patch block. Decide what you would want in the center (20 squares), in the corners (80 squares) and then in the middle of the sides (80 squares).

You will also need your machine, thread, pins, rotary cutter, 24" ruler, and a cutting matt (No smaller than 18-inches - maybe you could share with someone).

If you would like the directions with the picture of my quilt; please let me know. I can email it or snail mail.

## *White Glove Committee*

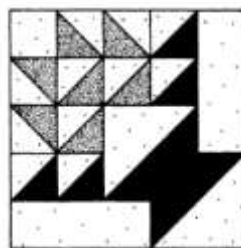
### WHAT ARE WHITE GLOVE LADIES AND WHY DO WE NEED THEM AT QUILT SHOWS?

### Spring Retreat 2011

The SPRING RETREAT is **APRIL 15 -17, 2011**. Again you can go extra nights such as Tuesday, April 12, Wednesday, April 13, and/ or Thursday, April 14, at an additional fee.

The retreat is held at the Byers Conference Center at the Roxbury Camp in Roxbury, PA. It is a weekend to “eat, sleep, & quilt”. You bring whatever projects you want to work on along with your sewing machine if you want and spend the weekend quilting while the Roxbury staff feed us and take care of everything for us. It’s a lot of fun and you get to know other members during the weekend. The sleeping rooms are like 5-star hotel room.

There will be registration sheets available at the January meeting to sign up for the retreat. You can pay ½ or the entire retreat fee when you sign up in January. The total fee must be paid by the April meeting. If you have any questions about this, please see Dottie Moreland or Joyce Randolph.

The rates for the retreat are as follows:  
Weekend rate – this includes 2 nights lodging (Friday & Saturday) and 5 meals starting Friday evening

\$122/person – double occupancy

\$131/person – single occupancy

Extra nights – no food service on Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday

\$40/ night/.person – double occupancy

\$45/night/person – single occupancy

If you are sharing a room with a room mate for the weekend and you want to come the extra nights and your room mate doesn’t, then the extra nights will be at the single occupancy rate for you while the 2 weekend nights will be at the double occupancy rate for you and your room mate.

If you can’t come for the entire weekend you can come on a daily basis at a nominal fee of \$6/day plus the meal fee, or for \$11/ day without the meal.
