She announced (that) the **Documentation Committee** will be (dissolved) as they have reached their goal. They have produced a beautiful book. The disposition of the funds that were left were voted on by the Board and approved.

-Mim Huffman and Leilani Brechbill provided a history of the documentation process from the beginning. They stated grants and private donations made this possible. There are approximately 50 books left. Ruth Mollack will have them for sale @ any time. They cost \$29.95 and an extra \$5.00 if they need to be sent out. The Committee to distribute remaining funds was chaired by Leilani Brechbill. Leaders of The Franklin County Make a Wish Foundation, The Franklin County Historical Society, The Franklin County Foundation and The LeTorte Guild in Carlisle were awarded funds. A scrapbook is now being made and any residual monies will be placed back into our Treasury. Two Announcements were made.

Ruth Mollack reported the **Documentation Committee Treasurer's Report**. The Balance, Deposits, Expenses and Ending Balance were given.

Sunshine Committee: Lee Hively reported on the Sunshine Committee. She received a thank you from Jerine Dunham for the quilt she was given upon the death of her husband. Lee asked us to remember:

Linda Dahlmann said she has 10-15 doll quilts for **Toys for Tots**. They can be turned in as late as December.

Quilt Show: Dottie Moreland discussed "It's Not Your Grandma's Quilt Show" @ Falling Springs Church. She has cards with a picture of the raffle quilt available for distribution. She requested volunteers to distribute these in areas women congregate. She gave a list of the committees which still need help. 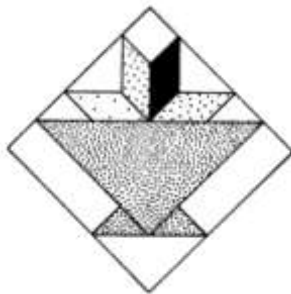

In Conclusion.....

From the time a group of interested Guild members met in 2004 to discuss the possibility of documenting Franklin County vintage quilts to the publication and sale of a book to the final disbursement of proceeds in 2011, momentum built and was maintained throughout the project.

As we reflect on that process we liken it to taking a journey. We had an idea that quickly evolved into a "map" for getting to our destination. We relied heavily on volunteers from the Guild and on professional textile conservators for their expertise. There were a few roadblocks and challenges along the route but never regrets or a desire to turn back. Information that we learned about our county, the many beautiful and diverse quilts that we saw, interesting and knowledgeable people we met and charting the unknown territory of publishing a book far exceeded any obstacles along the way.

It is with great pride and satisfaction that we reached our destination. With our mission accomplished the time has arrived to dismantle the documentation committee. That has happened in recent weeks with the disbursement of the book sale proceeds to cultural and charitable organizations, closing the documentation banking account and transferring remaining funds to the Guild treasury, moving the documentation files to the Franklin County Historical Society (Kittochinny) for permanent storage and compiling a scrapbook that will be placed in the Guild library.

We are grateful to the Chambersburg Quilt Guild, Inc. for sponsoring this project. It has been a memorable and rewarding experience. Thanks to all of you who helped to write this piece of Franklin County history and to all who shared this journey with us.

While I was in Lancaster County last month with my niece, an Amish quilt shop owner gave us these washing instructions for a new quilt. Thought I would share them with you..

1st. time washing a new quilt, use 1 cup of table salt in cold water ---- to set the colors--- Dry.

Other washings use luke -warm water and a mild detergent-like Ivory Snow.
