The Retreat will soon be here, Nov. 14 - 16, and boy am I looking forward to it! I need the alone time to get some things done and time to enjoy friends and relax.



**Fall Retreat**  
**November 14 - 16, 2008.**

Again you can go extra nights such as Wednesday and/or Thursday, at an additional fee. The retreat is held at the Byers Conference Center at the Roxbury Camp in Roxbury, PA. It is a weekend to "eat, sleep, & quilt". You bring whatever projects you want to work on along with your sewing machine if you want and spend the weekend quilting while the Roxbury staff feed us and take care of everything for us. It's a lot of fun and you get to know other members during the weekend. The sleeping rooms are like 5-star hotel rooms. You don't have to bring anything except what you want to work on for the weekend. Sign-up sheets will be available at the September meeting. You can pay 1/2 or all of the retreat fee when you sign up in September. The total fee must be paid by November 7th. The rates for the retreat are as follows:

Weekend rate – this includes 2 nights lodging and 5 meals starting Friday evening  
\$105/person – double occupancy  
\$115/person – single occupancy

Extra nights – no food service on Wednesday or Thursday

\$34/ night/.person – double occupancy  
\$38.50/night/person – single occupancy

If you are sharing a room with a room mate for the weekend and you want to come the extra nights and your room mate doesn't, then the extra nights will be at the single occupancy rate for you and the 2 weekend nights will be at the double occupancy rate for you and your room mate.

If you can't come for the entire weekend you can come on a daily basis at a nominal fee of \$5/ day unless you order a meal on Friday or Saturday, then you will only pay the cost of the meal.

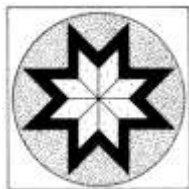

**DIRECTIONS:** Route 997 North toward Newburg. Approximately 2 miles beyond Blue Mountain Turnpike Exchange, there is a fork in road with 997 going to left. Follow 997 to cross road of Three Square Hollow. Turn left, \*cross over turnpike - just beyond, road forks - stay to left (you are now on Clay Hill Road) and follow to stop sign - this is Three Sq Hollow. Go straight at stop sign and follow road up the hill.

At top of hill on right side is 1149 - my house sits down in a hollow. Name and number on mailbox.

Alternate route from Shippensburg is to follow Route 696 to Newburg. Turn right on Route 641 for approximately one block. Turn left on High Street - this becomes Three Sq Hollow just beyond the fire house. Follow to stop sign (Route 997), cross 997 and then follow directions from \* above.

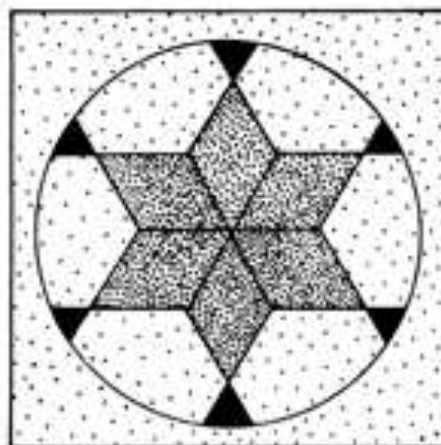
*Dangerous Chocolate Mug Cake*

- 4 T. sugar
- 2 T. baking cocoa
- 1 egg
- 3 T. milk
- 3 T. oil
- 3 T. chocolate chips (optional)

Combine flour, sugar and cocoa in mug.  
 Add egg, milk and oil.  
 Mix thoroughly.  
 Stir in chocolate chips if using.

Place mug in microwave for 3 minutes  
 (based on 1000 watts). The cake will  
 rise over the top of the mug, but don't

### Franklin County Quilt Documentation Committee

Documentation of antique Franklin County quilts was begun in May 2005. The project was sponsored by our Guild. Each year since that time the Guild has voted to support the project monetarily with a portion of the raffle ticket proceeds. We are grateful for the vote of confidence placed in us to carry the project from documentation through the book publication process.

We have received funding from many sources - foundations, NQA, clubs, other Guilds and private donors. We must remain diligent in our pursuit of all of these sources until the project is completed as expediently as possible. When we begin to sell books, that income will come back to the Guild and enable us to return a portion to the foundations that stipulate that as a part of their agreement and just as important, it will give the Guild the opportunity to allocate funds to the charitable and cultural interests of choice.

With the end of the project in sight we are once again asking for your support by designating the documentation project as the recipient of a portion of the 2009 raffle ticket proceeds.

**The Freedom Valley Chorus** is a part of Sweet Adelines International, a nonprofit music education association for women whose goal is to perpetuate the uniquely American art form -- a capella harmony, barbershop style. Freedom Valley Chorus was organized in September 2004 and chartered in June of 2007. We have 20 members who love to sing, laugh, and learn. Our weekly rehearsals combine exercises to develop the voice range, tonal quality and breath control, with learning new music, polishing repertoire songs, practicing visual performance and choreography. Performances and competitions help develop our singers' confidence and build pride in their achievements. Singing is the most ancient form of self-expression and an effective way to counter the everyday stresses of modern life. In addition to singing the women in the chorus have the opportunity to learn and grow by participating in activities such as the management team, costuming, choreography, make-up, set design, scripting, publicity, fund raising, or to be an emcee. We perform at a variety of places such as the Gettysburg Concert in the Park program, the Shippensburg Corn Festival, a Hagerstown Sun's Game, banquets, retail stores,

retirement facilities, church functions, and downtown Chambersburg activities. We charge modest fees for these performances and could use more support to help us to encourage more women to sing, to support educational opportunities for our director and assistant director, and each member of the chorus. Sweet Adelines International provides many opportunities for growth on the national and regional level. The most rewarding part of what we do is the opportunities to lift our spirits and the spirits of the people who hear us. None of us will forget the night we donated a performance to the retired nuns in Emmitsburg. They were so appreciative, smiling, and singing along. After the performance, we talked with them and felt their joy in spite of their infirmities. We all felt privileged to have shared some time with them.

If we are privileged to receive support for the chorus, we will look forward to the opportunity to thank you with our singing.

### Royal Family Kid's Camps (RFKC)

A camp for abused children aged 7-11 there are over 3 million abused children around the world every year. Heebner hopes the debut camp in July 2009 to have 30 campers. The goal is to increase by 6 children each year thereafter. The camp will provide an 'everybody birthday party', each child will receive T-shirts and music CDs of the music sang at camp., a photo album & memory bag .there is to be 1 counselor to 2 children to meet the special needs of the abused child. This camp aims to treat these children as royalty and give them a week of happy memories. There is no charge to the child the camp will operate under the auspices of First Assembly of God in Greencastle but is not a church camp but a community camp.
