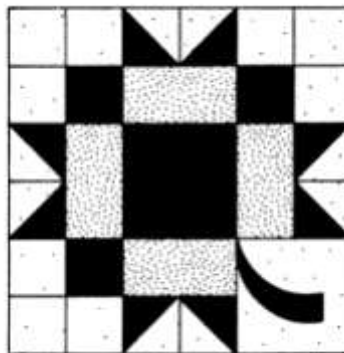

## Chambersburg Quilt Guild Meeting Minutes

The Guild meeting was held on 9/12/09 at 1:00pm at Trinity Lutheran Church, Chambersburg PA. 93 members attended and there were 8 new members and guests. The last meeting minutes were published in the Bee Line and approved by the members. The Treasurer report was given and approved by the members. The Documentation financial report was also given.

**Old Business:** Auditors reviewed the guild's records and all were in order. New logo shirt orders can be made at the October meeting.

**Raffle Quilt:** Last minutes tickets were sold. Winner was Barbara Basiliko, mother of our member Elizabeth Basiliko. \$4300 profit made a/o August. Members recognized Dottie Moreland and her committee for the work done on the quilt. **2009 Quilt Show Report:** Huge success, made over \$1893. Nancy thanked members for participating. **Documentation Book:** Ready 10/1/09. 300 orders have been taken so far for the book. Book plates will be available. Brochures are available for members to distribute. An additional amount was needed to complete book. Members approved the amount after the fact. Next book installment of \$1212.22 was also approved by the members.

**NEW BUSINESS:** The new budget was presented, questions were clarified and members approved it. **Programs:** Job description was changed to include 2 free programs. They will start in 2010/2011. Guests will be charged \$10 for workshops and \$5 for programs. Workshops and retreat sign up sheets are in the back. Bee Line has a list of the upcoming programs and workshops. A center block (pieced or appliqued) that is 8 to 10 inches

square which can be set on point without skewing the design. It

should be squared up and ready for the first addition. Include

with your block a minimum of one other fabric to be used

elsewhere in the quilt. You may include additional fabrics if you like.

Also bring a small notebook in which you have written something about yourself - your family, your interests, etc. The instruction

sheet will tell you what to add each month.

You will receive a numbered box at the meeting which will be

passed on each month with your block and fabrics. You will

receive someone else's box and instructions for the next row.

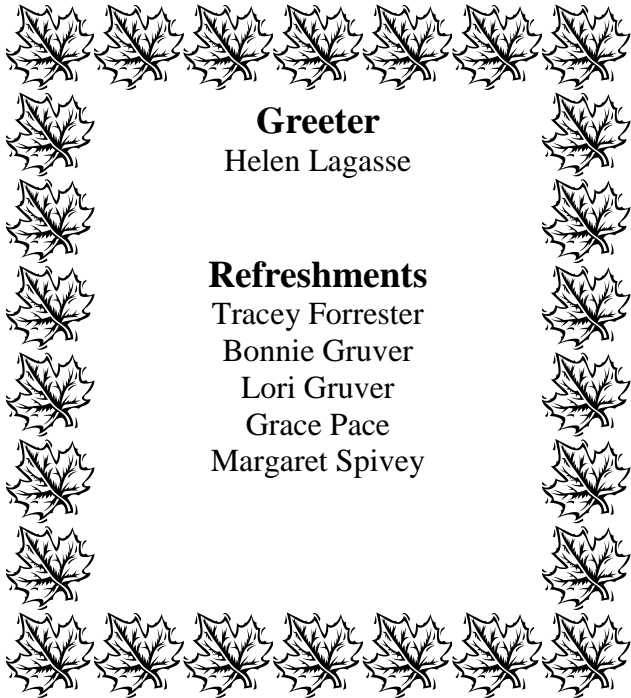

Volunteers Spread Warmth  
Quilts Bring Comfort to Service Members' Families

Debra Rogers was there. Eight years ago, as a Navy lieutenant, she was among the hundreds of civilian and military employees evacuated from the Pentagon after a hijacked jet was crashed into the complex on the morning of Sept. 11.

She watched from afar as smoke rose from a place considered the symbol of the nation's armed forces. She somberly wondered about her colleagues.

"You felt so helpless," said Rogers, who retired from active duty as a lieutenant commander last summer and is a management trainee at a Wal-Mart in Fairfax.

Her sense of helplessness was replaced with a conviction to take action and help families of service members. On Friday, she joined about 200 other volunteers to make quilts at RFK Stadium in Washington in honor of the inaugural Sept. 11 National Day of Service and Remembrance.

"It's pretty cool. You actually feel like you're getting to know" the families, Rogers said.

"This is like a keepsake you would treasure and pass on."

Volunteers gathered early in the morning at the stadium's Champion Club level to cut, pin, sew and iron fabric together for Operation Kid Comfort, a program of the Armed Services YMCA that creates customized quilts with images of deployed family members.

The event was a collaborative effort among several nonprofit groups and government and business organizations, including Greater DC Cares,

the D.C. Sports and Entertainment Commission, Armed Services YMCA and Wal-Mart. "The collaborative spirit is part of our organization," said Madye Henson, president of Greater DC Cares. "This is another opportunity for us to say thank you to those serving overseas."

The program was begun in 2003 at Fort Bragg, N.C., and has a network of volunteers across the country who make customized quilts from fabric on which photographs of deployed service men and women have been scanned.

Families requesting a quilt file an application and send nine photographs to begin the process. The completed quilts are delivered to children who might need help coping with the absence of a deployed parent.

"These quilts make a difference," said Michael J. Landers, deputy executive director of Armed Services YMCA. He said almost 6,000 children have received quilts since the program began.

About 80 requests remain unfilled. Twelve requests are from families in Virginia. More than 20 quilts were made Friday for families across the country.

Catherine Jung and her son Nathan were among the recipients. Her husband, John, a technical sergeant stationed at Andrews Air Force Base in Camp Springs, was deployed to Afghanistan in July.

"Oh my goodness. Thank you," Catherine Jung said to volunteer Giselle Schneider, 53, who made the quilt for the family. "This is so special. This is beautiful."

Schneider, of Great Falls, stitched together pieces of blue fabric with pictures of the Jungs taken at family events, including trips to the park, the White House Easter egg roll and Thanksgiving dinner.

A picture of John Jung in Afghanistan was placed in the center of the quilt. Nathan 2, seemed more intrigued by the helicopters and planes scattered among the pictures of his mom and dad. But his mother said she felt more secure.

"I know it's for the children, but I believe it brings just as much comfort to the families," she said, as she wiped away tears and clutched the quilt.

Henson said that she was excited to see the quilts ready to be sent to families and that she believed transforming a day of sorrow into a day of service was the best way to honor the victims of Sept. 11, 2001, and members of the military.

In April, President Obama signed the Serve America Act, a federal mandate to increase service opportunities by more than 150,000 positions over the next eight years. It takes effect next month.

Henson said people are ready. "People want to contribute and serve," she said. "Next year, you will see more opportunities to be engaged in service. This will only grow."

BYLAWS  
CHAMBERSBURG QUILT GUILD, INC.

ARTICLE IV  
Members

Section 4. Membership forms shall be made available in the *April and May* newsletters as well as at the April and May meetings. Annual dues shall be payable to the Membership chair with the return of the membership form. To be included in the Guild Directory one must pay dues no later than *the September meeting of the following year*. Individuals whose membership lapses may rejoin at any time upon full payment of dues.

Change to "*March, April and May*"  
Change "the September meeting of the following" to "*August 1<sup>st</sup> of the following fiscal year*"

ARTICLE V  
The Guild Board

Section 1. The Guild Board shall consist of the offices of President, Vice-president, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, Treasurer and the following key positions: \_\_\_\_\_ Facilities, Historian, Hospitality, Librarian, Membership, Programs, Publicity and Sunshine.

Add *Guild Editor*,

Section 2. All Board members shall be elected for a term of one (1) year with the exception of the treasurer who shall serve a minimum two (2) year term \_\_\_\_\_.

Add "*and the Program Committee who shall serve a minimum of three (3) years*."

Section 4. *With the exception of the President and Vice-President all* other Board members may be elected each year for as many consecutive years as they are willing to serve.

Change to "*With the exception of the President, Vice President, Treasurer and Programs all*"

ARTICLE VI  
Duties of the Guild Board

Section 2. The Vice-President shall preside at meetings and be responsible for overseeing Guild activities in the absence of the President. The Vice-President shall be responsible for *publishing* the Guild newsletter and the Guild Directory. The Vice-President retains the key to the post office mailbox and shall check the mail regularly.

Change to "The Vice President shall be responsible for *oversight of the publishing of the* Guild newsletter and the Guild Directory."

Section 5. The Treasurer shall be in charge of the Guild funds by attending to their collection, banking and disbursements. The Treasurer shall keep proper records and files of all transactions. The Treasurer shall provide financial records to *two board-appointed Guild members for audit between the conclusion of the May meeting and prior to the September meeting*.

Change to "*two (2) board-approved, qualified auditors for audit between June 30<sup>th</sup> (completion of fiscal year) and the September meeting*."

Section 7. The Historian Chair (s) shall be responsible for keeping *an annual file with a* Membership Directory, newsletters, pertinent clippings \_\_\_\_\_ and pamphlets pertaining to the history of the Guild. The Historian shall maintain a scrapbook of photographs of member's quilt work.

Add "*annual file and scrapbook that will contain a*"

Add "*, photographs*"

ARTICLE VII  
Meetings

Section 5. A joint meeting of old and new Board members shall be held prior to June 15 to turn over

materials to new members, to tentatively approve programs for the coming year, *and to make budget proposals for the coming year.*

Change to “*and to make budget proposals for the coming year.*”

ARTICLE VIII  
Newsletter

Section 3. The *Vice-President* shall send one (1) free newsletter to prospective members. The Vice-President shall provide the Membership chair with newsletters to distribute to new members who have just joined the Guild.

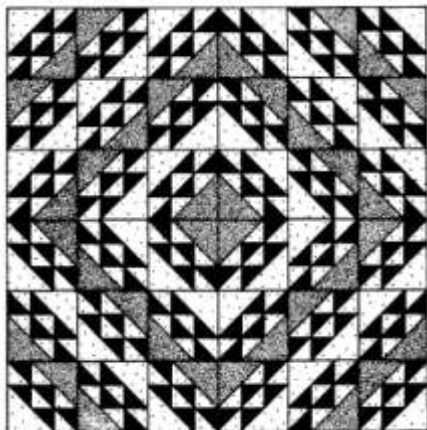
Change to “*Guild Editor*”
