



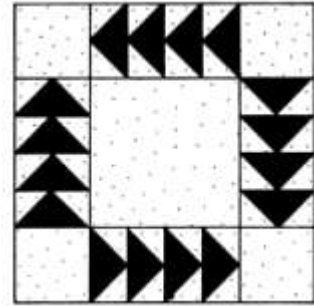

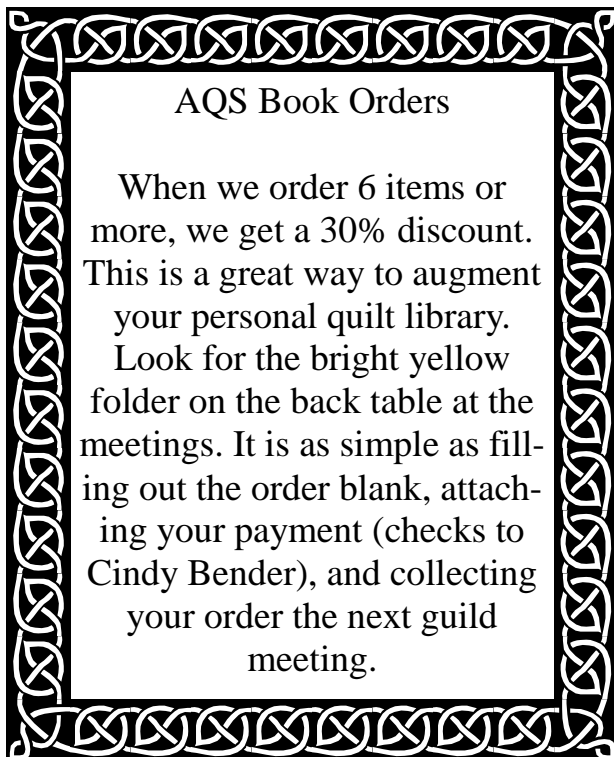

Dear Quilters,

The Menno Haven Auxiliary is pleased to announce its first Quilt Show and Sale. This event will be held Friday, October 26, 2007, 10:00 AM – 7:00 PM, & Saturday, October 27, 2007, 10:00 AM – 3:00 PM. It will be held at Chambersburg Mennonite Church Family Life Center, 1800 Philadelphia Avenue, Chambersburg, PA. Admission to the show will be on a cash donation basis.

We are excited about this venture and we invite your participation. We are looking for quilted items to show and to sell. Any quilted item will be accepted: quilts of any size, wall hangings, clothing, purses, pillows, etc. The article may be pieced, embroidered, appliquéd, whole cloth (no preprints), hand or machine quilted.

There is no cost to submit an item.

\* We will be glad to accept your donation of a quilt or quilted item for sale. The

auxiliary would receive 100% of the sale price.

\* We are accepting quilts or quilted items to be sold on consignment. Twenty percent (20%) of the selling price will go to the auxiliary. The submitter will set the price.

\* And we are accepting quilted items for show only. Do you have a unique item: unusual pattern, vintage quilt, or a quilt with a “story” to tell?

Your items for the show/sale need to be pre-registered by Oct. 5, 2007. Pre-registration information is attached. Fill out the information and send it to: Karen Martin, 1910 Springview Drive, Chambersburg, PA 17202. You may submit as many pieces as you want, however, we reserve the right to display items based on

space availability. Use a separate registration sheet for each item. You may copy the registration sheet as needed.

Each registered item should be placed in its own cloth bag. Pillowcases are great. Each bag should have your name and the name of the quilt / item on it.

All quilts and wallhangings **must** have a hanging sleeve on the back at least 4 inches deep. Each individual wallhanging or item should also have a label on the back with the owner's name, the name of the quilt and other info.

Quilts / Items will be received at the Family Life Center on Thursday, October 25, from 9:00 AM – 12:00 PM. Pick up will be Saturday, October 27, 2007 from 4:00 PM – 5:00 PM.

Another facet of our show is a Quilt Appraisal. Trained, qualified appraisers will be available to answer your questions about the age, value, and care of your vintage quilts. There will be a \$20.00 fee for an oral appraisal, or a \$35.00 fee for a written appraisal for insurance purposes. An appointment is recommended. Walk-ins are welcome; however, appointments will be given first priority. Only non-show quilts will be appraised.

Really Sharp Piecing (Friday 10/5)

This workshop is taken from the [book and video of the same name](#). This is a foundation piecing workshop but after this workshop you will look at foundation piecing in an entirely new light - the possibilities are endless! Go the full circle, with ease, and be assured of really sharp, very fine points throughout. This is what Barbara calls her 'instant gratification' workshop. It was developed from her award winning quilt, "[Solstice](#)". Barbara demonstrated her technique earlier this year on the television programme 'Simply Quilts'



Aloha (Saturday 10/6)

This workshop is a multi-technique class that encompasses several aspects of machine work. It came about through playing with the new Foolproof Circles set for rotary cutting. The circle is manipulated and used in fun and ingenious ways. You will also learn a whole new approach to appliqué that guarantees smooth curves in simple shapes like this one. The appliqué is simple but effective and **can be done before quilting or later using the "appli-quilt" technique**. Sewn in any colour scheme it's lots of fun because it somehow feels like a bit of a cheat but it's not - you are simply creating a really fun quilt in super quick time!

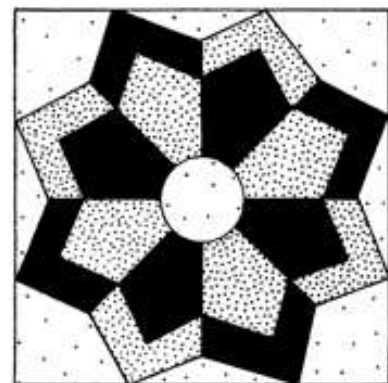
### JEM Tours

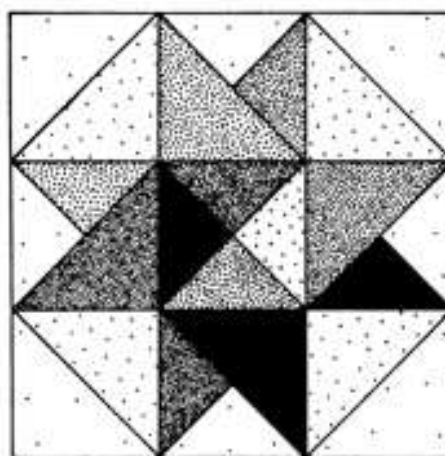

### **FALL RETREAT 2007**

The Fall Quilt Retreat will be held November 2-4, 2007 at Byers Conference Center, Roxbury, PA. Over the years the number of members who attend the retreats have steadily increased. Between the three quilt groups, Buchanan Trail Quiltmakers, Friendship Quilters, & Chambersburg Quilt Guild, there were 75 people who attended the Spring Retreat. Due to the increased participation, it was felt that a committee of people from the three groups would be helpful to make the retreats run smoothly. The committee is made up of Dottie Moreland, Sue Frederick, Sheri Newcomer, Joyce Randolph, and Grace Pace. The following are a few changes that will be taking place with the 2007 Fall retreat:

1 – Members may sign-up for the Fall retreat at the September meeting and the Spring retreat at the January meeting. Contact Sue Frederick or Sheri Newcomer for the Buchanan Trail Quiltmakers, Sheri Newcomer for the Friendship Quilters, and Dottie Moreland for Chambersburg Quilt Guild.

2 – Half of the retreat fee is due when you sign up with the other half due at the October meeting (February meeting for the Spring retreat). The fee for the Fall retreat is \$102/ double occupancy and \$111/single occupancy. The conference center is available for early participants if you wish to go early on Wednesday and/or Thursday. The fee for the extra night's lodging is \$33/night/double occupancy and \$37/night/single occupancy. If you are planning to go Wednesday and Thursday as well as the weekend but your roommate is only going to be there for the weekend, you will be charged for a single room for Wednesday and Thursday and a double room Friday and Saturday.

3 – A flyer with more in depth information about the retreat will be available at the September meeting.
