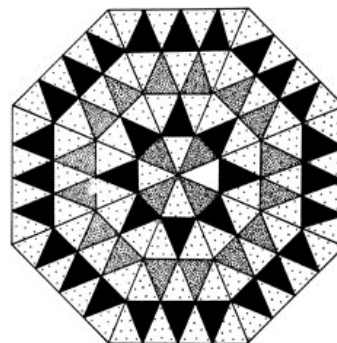

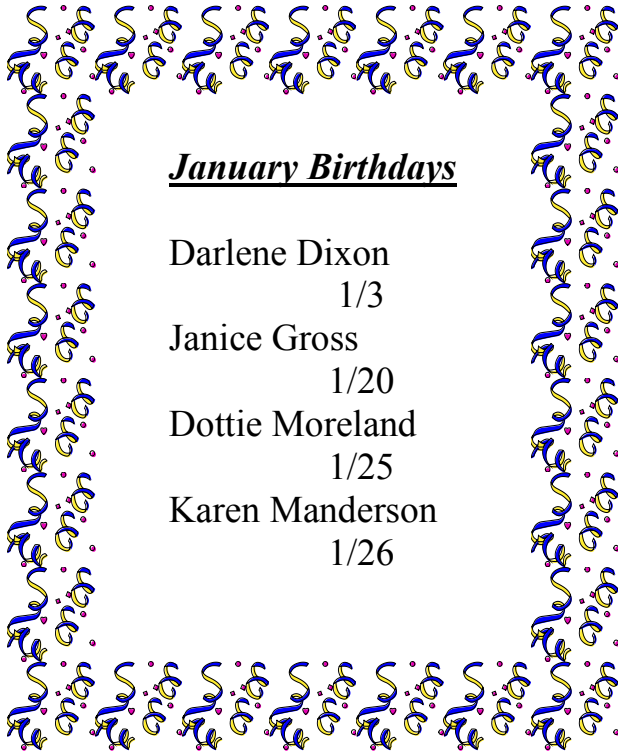

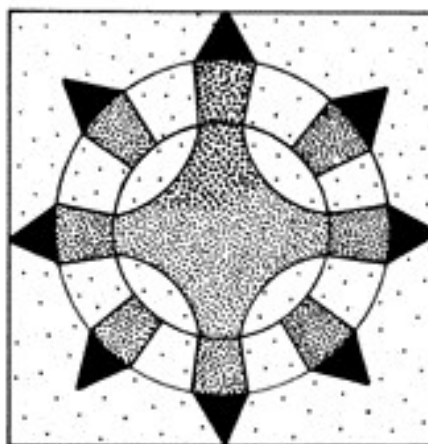
Come and join us. We share this time

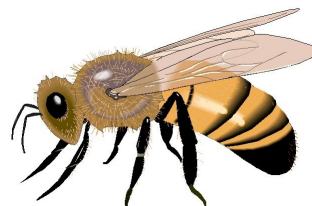
